## Summer Bargain Bins

The search begins in July through October for the sale on perennials. Most retail nurseries have an annual clearance sale to move plants. They do not want to hold the plants over for another season so they reduce the prices typically 50% or more.

The hunt is on to find the clearance area in the back of the display area, under a bench, or in an unrelated area.

A bargain is only a bargain if the price is reduced and the plant is healthy. Look for a plant with multiple stems that are still green in color when purchasing in the summer. It is not important that the plant flowered while at the nursery. It is helpful if the plant still has identification so you will know the color and height of the plant.

Shriveled stems, multiple bent

stems, plants that have fallen out of the pot and repotted, or dried up pots should be avoided.

Give the plant sun and water to maintain health until it is transplanted. Plant the bargain peony in autumn for best results. Next spring you can smile with satisfaction. Blooms will start anywhere from the first year until the third year after planting depending on the plant's health.
